## Efficiency of Linear Programming, Integer Programming and Minimal Spanning Tree for Network Model

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## Abstract

The problem of finding minimal spanning tree is a famous combinatorial optimization problem for which polynomial time algorithms exits. The problem of finding minimal spanning tree appears in different engineering and service applications, particularly in designing computers, telecommunication, transportation and water supply network.
