Flower Power
Exploring Parts of a Flower
through DIY Craft

For KG-2



Objective:

Students will learn about the different parts of a flower (petals, stem, leaves, and roots) through a fun and interactive DIY craft activity.



Materials:

Flower petals

Flower leaves

Scissors

Glue

Pipe cleaners (for stems and roots)

Markers or crayons

Flower templates (attached in this document)

Instructions:

Introduction (5 minutes):

Discuss flowers and their importance in nature.

Introduce the basic parts of a flower: petals, stem, leaves, and roots.


Worksheet Section 1: Labeling (20 minutes):

- Label the parts of the flower in the provided diagram.
- Use the word bank to match the correct terms (petals, stem, leaves, and roots) to each part, by cutting the names from the bottom and paste it on the correct part of the flower, then color the flower parts according to the key provided.

Color Key:

- Petals: Red/pink/yellow
- Stem: Dark green
- Leaves: Light green
- Roots: Brown


Cut out the flower parts at the bottom of the page. Glue them onto the blank rectangles to correctly label your flower

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Worksheet Section 2: DIY Flower Assembly (15 minutes):

Use the green Pipe cleaners for stem, brown Pipe cleaners for roots, Flower petals for flower and Flower leaves for leaves and attach them to your flower worksheet.



Conclusion (10 minutes):

let each student think about what is the most important part of flower from his/her perspective.

Share your DIY flowers and your thoughts with the class.

Discuss the importance of each part in making a complete and functional flower.

Additional Notes for Teachers:

Encourage creativity in the coloring and assembly process.

Circulate and assist students as they work on their DIY flowers.

Use the provided word bank for spelling consistency.

Discuss the unique features of each student's flower during the sharing session.
